


EASTER

The date for when Easter falls is usually either described as 'early' or as being 'late.' This is due to the fact that Easter, unlike say Christmas, is a moveable Feast Day. The earliest it can fall is the 22nd March, and the latest the 25th April. Therefore, we may well describe Easter this year as being 'late,' in view of Easter Sunday falling upon the 17th April.

The date for celebrating Easter varied considerably for a number of centuries and was not universally resolved until the 7th Century. For Western Christians the date is set as the first Sunday after the Full Moon from the 21st March; such a reference having its roots in the Passover Festival in the Bible's Old Testament. Once Easter Sunday is identified the rest of the Christian Year falls into place; Palm Sunday, Pentecost, Trinity, Ascension Day....

Although the exact date when Easter was first celebrated is not entirely sure. Easter is certainly a far older Feast Day than Christmas. What is certain is that the proclamation 'Jesus is Risen,' has been central to Christianity from the time of the first Christian disciples; had there been no first Easter Sunday, then we would have no Christianity.

Equally it is uncertain when the symbolism of eggs and rabbits were associated with Easter, although such images at Easter are very ancient. Eggs and rabbits are thought to be symbolic of new life at springtime, and Easter is the celebration of Jesus' resurrection and the new life or fresh start that people receive when they become Christians. Churches use Easter Day to praise God for raising Jesus from the dead, and to remember





QUEENS JUBILEE TORCH RELAY SUFFOLK



UNUSUAL PERENNIALS VEGETABLES

If you are bored of growing ordinary vegetables why not try something different. There is a growing trend for "forest gardening" – this is growing plants in a framework similar to a forest – with a canopy layer of trees, an understorey of shrubs and herbaceous plants and a ground layer of low growing plants. These plants are all perennials- so once planted will live for several years and so give a harvest each year.

Here is a list of edible herbaceous perennial plants that could be part of your ornamental garden as well as your vegetable garden:

- 1. Sea beat (*Beta vulgaris* subs *maritima*) is a seaside plant that resembles spinach and beetroot leaves eat the young shoots in spring and the leaves can be eaten all year. Use leaves like spinach lightly steam or boil leaves, Pinch out flowering shoots to encourage leaf production.
- 2. King's Spear (*Asphodeline lutea*) is a clump forming herbaceous perennial from south Europe usually grown as an ornamental plant. Harvest young shoots, in late summer, autumn and in winter and spring. Shoots can be eaten like asparagus. The flowers are sweet and used in salads. Roots can also be eaten harvested in the autumn and winter. They have a nutty flavour.
- 3. Cardoons are large grey leaved Mediterranean evergreen perennial thistle like plants with tall flowering stems; each leaf reaching 80cms tall and flowering stem, up to 2m. (*Cynara cardunculus*) Harvest leaf ribs and stalks from mature leaves. The ribs have some bitterness but the leaf stalks can be blanches. Boil the leaf ribs and stalks then peel before eating. They have a celery like flavour, Cardoon sticks go well with eggs and cheese. You can also eat immature flower heads when boiled, they are like globe artichokes. Cardoon roots are also edible.
- 4. Lovage (*Levisticum officinale*) an herbaceous perennial with young leaves that have a yeasty flavour.
- 5. Ostrich fern (*Matteuccia struthiopteris*) this is a hardy fern from Northern hemisphere. It spreads by rhizomes each plant reaching 1.5m tall and 60cms wide. You can eat the young curled shoots called fiddleheads boil them for 15minutes they have a flavour that is a cross between aspargus and broccoli.
- 6. Fuki (*Petasites japonica*) Large leaved herbaceous perennial you can eat the stlaks like rhubarb. Cook the stems then peel them.
- 7. Solomon's Seal (*Polygonatum sp.*) this is usually grown as an ornamental plant with attractive pinnate leaves and white drop like flowers. You can eat the young shoots like asparagus.
- 8. Sweet Cicely (*Myrrhis odorata*) this is a native to Northern Britain, It has aniseed flavoured leaves and shoots and roots but best to eat the seeds.



SPRING

Longer days? Check. Warmer weather? ... Spring is on the horizon, so get ready for the change in the seasons by familiarising yourself with spring highlights from wildlife.

Frogs and Toads One of the most familiar signs of spring is the appearance of jelly-like spawn in ponds. In spring, frogs and toads emerge and begin to spawn following hibernation. Frog spawn is easily differentiated from toad spawn because it appears in large balls or clumps, whereas toad spawn is found in long chains attached to plants and weeds. Male frogs will return to the same pond in which they matured and will continue to return to the same spot for the rest of their lives. If you'd like frogs to keep returning to your pond each year, make sure you keep a small gap or hole in fences so that they can access your garden.

While immense balls of spawn may make a pond seem overcrowded – as much of 90% of tadpoles are being lost to predators – the actual number of eggs that survive to adulthood will be a fraction of the spawn you see. It takes 13-16 weeks for tadpoles to mature and, as spring progresses into summer, tiny froglets can be found leaving the pond around June. That said, there is evidence that frogs and toads are breeding earlier, which could be due to milder weather in winter months, so spawn can appear in the pond as early as February.

Bumblebees The first bumblebees start to return in March and these will be queens who have survived the winter months and are in search of spring flowers. *Bombus terrestris*, the buff-tailed bumblebee queen, is the largest UK species and is usually the first bee to emerge. This is the first stage of the bumblebee lifecycle as the queen feeds and begins to search for a suitable nesting site such as a hole in the ground, bird box or even under garden sheds. She will lay her first clutch of eggs and these will become the female worker bees. The larvae are fed by the queen so throughout spring you will see queen bumblebees busily collecting pollen to feed their growing workers, who will emerge as adults in the summer.

Butterflies As spring brings out the warmer weather butterflies begin to emerge, and with their colourful wings and gentle fluttering it's easy to understand why they are such a popular sign of spring. The arrival of butterflies is also an important measure of the effects of weather on our wildlife. Many of the UK's rare spring butterflies in 2017 emerged three weeks earlier compared to 2016 and a week earlier than the average. The Butterfly Conservation believe this to be as a result of milder weather.

The Big Butterfly Count is a great way for you to get involved with the study and conservation of butterfly populations. Simply pick a spot such as a garden or park from where to watch for 15 minutes and record any butterflies you see using an identification sheet.

Badgers With striking black and white markings, badgers are one of the UK's most iconic wild mammals. While they do not hibernate, their activity is significantly reduced throughout the colder winter months, but in spring they begin to appear as warm weather brings their most favourite food, the earthworm, back to the soil surface. Groups of badgers are called a clan and they live in a sett, a series of intertwining tunnels with purpose-built chambers for sleeping or nursing. Spring is the perfect time to spot these beautiful creatures when their activity is on the rise and overgrowth hasn't blocked the view of their sett entrance entirely. Cubs are typically born in February in groups of two or three and will gradually explore the sett until mid -April when they emerge, their mother ever watchful.

SAUCY CHICKEN

- 225g (8oz) frozen broccoli (thawed) or fresh mushrooms

METHOD

- 2. Combine the undiluted chicken soup with the mayonnaise, cream and curry powder. Spoon over the chicken then sprinkle with grated cheese.
- 3. Bake in oven for about an hour until the chicken is cooked through and cheese is turning golden brown.
